Words of Encouragement By Janet Cressy

On the 25th April 1792 the Priest and Poet, John Keble, was born. He went to Oxford University and was one of the Leaders of the Oxford Movement. In fact Keble College is named after him.

John Keble was ordained in 1815 and eventually became Rector of Hursley in 1836 until 1841. In 1827 he anonymously published a book of poems for each Sunday and Feast Day of the Christian year. This was the most popular book of verse in the 19th century.

John Keble was responsible for building a new Church and for compiling a book of hymns for every Sunday and Holy Day in the year. In addition he wrote other sermons and biographies.

One of his best known poems is "New Every Morning is the Love" which is frequently sung as a hymn.

We remember John Keble this week, as he died on the 14th July 1866 and in his lifetime he must have encouraged many people to worship God through his weekly poems, his hymns and his sermons.
